HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR WAS CALCULATED

The CBS News/YouGov survey of 2,460 adults in the U.S. was conducted between September 8–11, 2026. Respondents were selected to be representative of adults nationwide.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, education, and 2024 presidential vote. Weighting targets come from the U.S. Census American Community Survey and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey. “Likely voters” – respondents’ relative probabilities of voting – were determined using a regression model that incorporates current, self-reported intentions to vote, along with individual-level and aggregate data about voters, such as demographics and vote history. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.0, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.59.

The *margin of error* (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately ± 2.3 points. It is calculated using the formula

$$100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + CV^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error. The sample estimate should differ from its expected value – the average of all estimates obtained by repeating the same sample selection and weighting procedures – by less than the margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.

The estimated numbers of Republican and Democratic seats come from a statistical model developed by CBS News and YouGov, which includes data from this poll, past vote and other district-level characteristics, demographics and historical patterns. These estimates are subject to statistical error. We simulate many elections, with the error calibrated to include historical polling accuracy, to obtain a range of seat estimates. We report 95% confidence intervals from the simulations. These estimates describe which party is ahead today and may change as additional data are collected closer to the election.
