Background French-American School of New York

- For over thirty years, The French-American School of New York has been providing a bilingual, bicultural French and American education to an American, French and International student population
- ➢ FASNY currently educates 865 students per year from Nursery to Grade 12
- ➢ FASNY students and families represent more than 40 nationalities
 - 47% American Citizens
 - 53% International
- Currently renting 3 separate campuses in Scarsdale, Larchmont, and Mamaroneck
- On January 20, 2011 FASNY purchased the former Ridgeway Country Club in White Plains and has been planning the sustainable and clustered development of a new unified campus on approximately 46 acres of the property
- FASNY created a Conservancy Task Force with the objective of identifying the best use of the 84 acres of permanent open space as an extension of the FASNY Campus and educational program

"How can we realize the unique opportunity for our new campus and utilize the land for the benefit of children and the environment in a way that embodies and furthers our vision, values, and educational mission within the local community?"

- **6th How does this contribute to our Comprehensive Master Plan?**







- Vegetated Storm Water Basins


Sustainable Building Design

Why Greens to Green?

Greens to Green converts 84 acres of private golf course "Greens" into a

restored natural "Green" open space for passive use and conservation

Why a Conservancy?

We are NOT a Park

➢ We prioritize low impact and passive use

We are NOT a Nature Center

We prioritize education but do not have a Nature Center that runs active public programs that attract many visitors

We are a Conservancy

- > We prioritize the conservation of nature and educational natural resources
- ➢ We are not preserving a golf course but are progressively restoring and revitalizing natural resources and a diversity of ecological habitats
- We are inclusive and we welcome members of the community who would like to join in realizing and sustaining this unique opportunity



Ownership

> The Conservancy will be owned by the French-American School of New York

Permanent Conservation Easement

The Conservancy will be deeded as perpetual open space

Maintenance

FASNY will be fully responsible for the maintenance of the Conservancy just like it will be responsible for the maintenance of the Campus

Security

FASNY will be fully responsible for the security of the Conservancy just like it will be responsible for the security of the Campus


Low-Intensity Use

The Conservancy will serve as a natural extension of the school and will augment FASNY's educational mission

FASNY is offering the neighborhood open access to the Conservancy with limited hours from dawn to dusk








Existing Natural Features







Golf Courses vs. Natural Open Space



32 Golf Courses within 10 Miles

32 Public and Private Golf Courses are within 10 miles of the former Ridgeway Country Club

➢ The Greens to Green Conservancy at FASNY will be a substantial addition to the publicly accessible natural open space in the City of White Plains

Meadows are an endangered and valuable habitat for diverse bird species

➢ FASNY is no longer using harmful pesticides and is no longer irrigating golf course fairways and greens



Historical Use "Greens to Green"

Golf Courses are struggling and the industry is in secular decline

- **Ridgeway Country Club was unable to remain viable as a golf course**
- Ridgeway Country Club was not successful in increasing membership
- The City of White Plains studied the feasibility of a public golf course and voted against it
- Several other golf courses are under similar pressure there are already too many competing golf courses in the area

Historical Use

- Before this land was a private golf course and country club, it was the Gedney Farm for over 200 years
- Prior to being developed into Gedney Farm, this land was a natural and undeveloped space
- > We are restoring this land to a well-managed natural diverse habitat
