




Great Chicago Fire - Oct. 8-10, 1871

Killed 300 people, left 100,000 people homeless, and destroyed over 3 square miles of the city...

...led to stricter fire safety laws and building codes, including banning wooden buildings within city limits.



Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire - March 25, 1911

The deadliest industrial disaster in New York's history, causing the deaths of 146 garment workers...

...Governor Al Smith and Frances
Perkins passed the first state workplace
guarantees in the country in 1911.

The Great Mississippi Flood – 1927

The most destructive river flood in the country's history, affecting more than 630,000 people...

...Congress passed the Flood Control Act of 1928 to levee future flooding – at the time, the largest public works appropriation ever.

The Great Depression – 1929-1939

The longest, deepest, and most widespread economic depression of the 20th century...

...reversed through President Franklin Delano Roosevelt's New Deal legislation, leading to the dawn of the "American Century".

9/11 – September 11th, 2001

2,977 innocent Americans lost their lives in the deadliest terrorist attack on American soil...

...the Department of Homeland Security was established, representing the largest restructuring of the U.S. government in contemporary history.

Superstorm Sandy – Oct. 22nd – Nov. 2nd, 2012

Killed at least 53 people and caused \$32.8 billion in damages in New York alone...

...we built back stronger and made our infrastructure more resilient, establishing the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery.
