Dear Lutz Families:

We appreciate the time and effort Kindergarten Enrichment (KE) and After School Club (ASC) parents took to complete our "Emergency School's Out Days" survey. We have heard you! Based on your feedback, many of you will need care in the event that schools are not in session but the unexpected cost of full day care could be a hardship. Moreover, most of you wanted care to stay at Lutz.

We are working with other community partners (School/Park District and other non profits) to support families and keep children safe in the event that the teacher union calls a strike. Yesterday we met and learned that, should negotiations fail, there could be a strike starting October 15th or 16th.

Here are some of the proposed options for District 112 families:

1) **Alternative Learning Centers** run by District administrators & volunteers:

a. Oak Terrace School (K-5) 8:30 am – 2:30 pm b. Northwood Junior High (6-8) 8 am – 2 pm

2) Park District Park Play Day Camps (partial list):

a. West Ridge Center (K) 9 am - 3 pm b. West Ridge Center (1-2) 9 am - 3 pm c. Recreation Center of HP (3-5) 8:30 am-2:30 pm

Our Plan: To help out families of our current school-age students, Lutz will be providing <u>wrap-around care with transportation to and from the above locations</u> (See attached for more details). We may have limited space availability for additional siblings and Camp alums. Please know that there also will be extended care at Oak Terrace (Family Network) and the City's Firehouse Youth Center for middle school students. Please note that:

- Care will be available at Lutz from 7:30 am.
- Pre-registered and approved children going to Oak Terrace must be at Lutz by 8:00 am and those children going to West Ridge/HP Recreation Center must be at Lutz by 8:30 am
- Lutz will pick up at 2:30 pm from Oak Terrace and 3 pm from West Ridge and the HP Recreation Center.
- We will **only** have a full-day program for a limited number of our kindergarteners.

SPACE FOR WRAP-AROUND CARE WILL BE LIMITED BY OUR BUS CAPACITY.

<u>PRE-REGISTRATION</u> will be critical for all these programs including ours! The School District will send out materials October 9th and there will be a strict deadline to pre-register. There is limited capacity so if you need care-**act fast**!

In lieu of wrap-around care, parents are welcome to drop off their children at Lutz at their regular program times as these **programs will be running as usual**. Please indicate that on the attached form so we can staff accordingly. Please don't hesitate to contact us should you need further information.

Lutz Options in Event of a Strike

JCYS Lutz will offer the following programs in the event of a Teachers' Union strike.
