**Responses to Reports to the Title IX Coordinator or Responsible Employees**

It should be noted that several cases that were reported to have occurred outside of Clery geography were addressed through the complaint resolution process, however, given the reporting guidelines, these are not reflected in the data.

\*For two cases (one sexual violence and one stalking), the students were placed on University Probation, received a Limitation on University Access and Activities, Extended No Contact Directive, and in one case the restriction from taking the same classes as the Complainant.

For the third case (sexual violence), after an investigation completed by the Title IX Deputy Coordinator and meeting with the two students involved, the hearing committee did not feel there was enough evidence to find the respondent guilty of alleged occurrence. The committee did feel the student acted unprofessionally under the school's academic policy. The student was put on probation for one, required to make a written apology to the complainant for unprofessionalism, and required to use the schools emotional counseling services.
