
I, the complainant in this case, state that the following is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

AFFIDAVIT OF JUAN M. HERRERA

I, Juan M. Herrera, being duly sworn, depose and state as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. I am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and have been for twelve and a half years. During this time, I have investigated numerous violations of federal law related to violent crimes to include violations associated with threatening communications.
2. This affidavit includes information based on my personal knowledge and my communications with others who have personal knowledge of the events and circumstances described herein.
3. This affidavit does not contain all the information known to law enforcement regarding this investigation. The information included is meant to establish probable cause that Billy STREET willfully made threats to kill, injure, and intimidate any individual and to damage and destroy a building or real property by means of an explosive, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 844(e). Further, STREET did transmit, in interstate commerce, a communication which contained a threat to

injure the person of another, specifically Adult Victim 1, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 875(c).

II. SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

4. On November 1, 2017, an officer from the Eastpointe Police Department (EPD) interviewed Adult Victim-One (AV-1). AV-1 reported that, earlier that day, she received threatening text messages from her ex-son-in-law, Billy STREET. STREET was married to AV-1's daughter. STREET and AV-1's daughter have a ten-year-old daughter who is in AV-1's custody.

5. AV-1 advised that STREET sent her multiple text messages. One of the messages indicated that he was going to blow up AV-1's home with her and her grandchildren inside. In a text message, STREET sent AV-1 a photograph of what appeared to be a metallic pipe and an electronic device taped together. The metallic pipe and the electronic device appeared to be a pipe bomb. The EPD officer took photographs of the text conversations between STREET and AV-1:

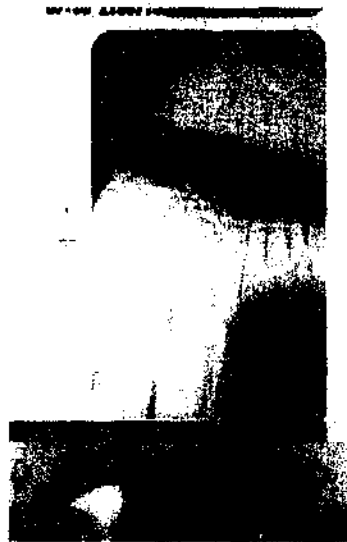

6. STREET texted the picture depicted in Image 2. The item in Image 2 appears to be a cylindrical object wrapped in black electrical tape. A 9V battery appears to be attached.

7. Subsequent to sending the texts in Image 1 and 2, STREET sent the following texts

- a. "... you [sic] your grandmother and your daughter are going to die";
- b. "Your grand kids [sic] too"; and
- c. "I'm putting this dynamite under your pillow bitch."

8. A review of LEIN, through NCIC, further identified STREET as Billy Wayne STREET, II, date of birth of XX/XX/1981. STREET has

the following outstanding warrants: Misdemeanor Failure to Appear on the charge of malicious use of telecommunications service. The warrant is dated September 26, 2017.

9. On November 3, 2017, STREET had a ticket to fly from Detroit Metro Airport to Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. That day, the Airport Police Authority arrested STREET at the airport. During the booking process, STREET made general statements in reference to explosives. During booking, STREET indicated that the warrants he was arrested on were nothing because he had other things going and that the "Feds" would never catch him. STREET then stated that he was dealing with explosives and that it had nothing to do with the airport. STREET stated that the explosives were for the city and one person in particular. STREET did not provide a name for this "one person."

10. A Cooperating Witness (CW-1) reviewed the picture depicting the cylindrical object wrapped in black electrical tape that STREET texted to AV-1 (see Image 2). CW-1 advised that STREET possessed that device approximately one week ago when he brought the

device to CW-1's house. STREET told CW-1 that the device was a bomb and that he was going to use it to blow up "[Adult Male]." CW-1 advised that "[Adult Male]" and AV-1's daughter have a child together. CW-1 advised that STREET left the house that same day and took the device with him.

11. Affiant and TFO Latour interviewed STREET at the Eastpointe Police Department. STREET was advised of his *Miranda* Rights. STREET waived his rights and provided the following information:


- a. His ex-wife, AV-1's daughter, was with him in South Carolina and left him approximately three or four days ago for another male; and
- b. he had a job working from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and was working over forty hours.

He began talking about AV-1's daughter and the other adult male, became angered, and requested an attorney. After STREET requested an attorney, the interview was terminated.

10. Thereafter, STREET, without further questioning, volunteered that "something was happening tonight" and he needed to make a call or "something's going to happen." STREET said that houses were going to "get blown" and asked Affiant and TFO Latour to get "his daughter out of the house" before it happened.

III. CONCLUSION

11. Probable cause exists that Billy Wayne STREET, II, willfully made threats to kill, injure and intimidate any individual and to damage and destroy a building or real property by means of an explosive, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 844(c) and (e).
