Barahona at Colombia Hospital. Jorge was read Miranda and stated he understood each warning. Jorge said he travelled North on I95 from Miami to West Palm Beach on February 14th, 2011 after he placed his deceased daughter in a plastic bag, which he loaded in the rear of his truck. He said he was accompanied by his son [REDACTED]. Jorge told us he was distraught over the death of his daughter and intended to commit suicide. Jorge said he pulled over onto a grassy area of the expressway where he would easily be found. He gave [REDACTED] a handful of sleeping pills and told him to take them so he could sleep. Jorge said [REDACTED] head remained on his lap as he sat in the vehicle's driver's seat pouring gasoline over his own head from the five gallon gas tank. Jorge intended to ignite a lighter to set himself on fire, but he could not do it because [REDACTED] was present.

Jorge incurred no obvious burns to his person unlike the injuries suffered by [REDACTED]. When confronted about the severity of [REDACTED]'s injuries, Jorge explained some of the gasoline must have splattered on [REDACTED]. Jorge's account of events is inconsistent with [REDACTED] Barahona's injuries. Based on these facts, I believe probable cause exists to charge Jorge Barahona for the crime of Aggravated Child Abuse, F.S.S. 827.03(2)a.

On February 14th, 2011, at approximately 0530 hours, Florida Department of Transportation Road Ranger Thomas Butler noted a red 1998 Toyota pickup parked on the East shoulder of North bound I-95, North of Palm Beach Lakes Blvd. Thomas approached the vehicle and noted the driver's seat was unoccupied. He saw a young child, ten year old [REDACTED] in the center seat next to an open five gallon gas tank. Thomas noted the child appeared to be in respiratory distress and trembling. The child's clothing was soaked with an unknown chemical. Thomas observed the defendant Jorge Barahona, unresponsive and supine on the ground outside the truck. Florida Highway Patrol and medics responded and transported Jorge and [REDACTED] to local hospitals for treatment of exposure and burns from an unknown chemical agent.

Due to the unknown chemical agent within the vehicle, it was decontaminated by Eagle SWS. Eagle SWS employee Allen Potts was cleaning the bed of the truck when he moved a black plastic bag from the front of the bed to the rear of the bed. Potts observed a human limb within the plastic bag. Potts notified FHP Troopers on scene of his discovery. Further investigation revealed the bag contained a deceased human body.

[REDACTED] is currently hospitalized in the Intensive Care Unit and is suffering from severe burns to his abdomen, upper thighs, and buttocks. Prior injuries were also discovered on [REDACTED] by medical staff and police. The injuries included a fractured clavicle, a fractured arm, scarring to his buttocks and lower abdomen, and ligature markings to both wrists.

On February 15th, 2011, Det. Sgt. Lefont, Det. Matias, and I interviewed Jorge
