To All Denver Police Employees,

I am pleased to let you know that a plan we have been working on to review and adjust the Denver Police Department's District and precinct boundaries has been presented to both the Mayor and City Council. Both have been very supportive of the effort.

I am now taking this opportunity to give you the information before it is released to the public.

I want to let you know that a talented group of people spent a great deal of time producing a variety of analytics, historical perspective, and community feedback to produce the boundaries that I have proposed. There were considerations given to the call volume, travel time, time spent on a call, and geographical barriers (like the Platte River or I-25). We also worked hard to create precincts that kept similar crime (or specific crime issues like East Colfax) within a police district or precinct. In short, this project was not designed on a whim, but was completed after careful consideration with a wide variety of input.

I have included detailed maps and call information for your review. These boundaries were created to make more efficient patrol operations possible. They were also designed with future staffing increases in mind; as patrol staffing increases with new hires, we can easily place them into precincts and have metrics in place to determine the growth rate of each precinct.

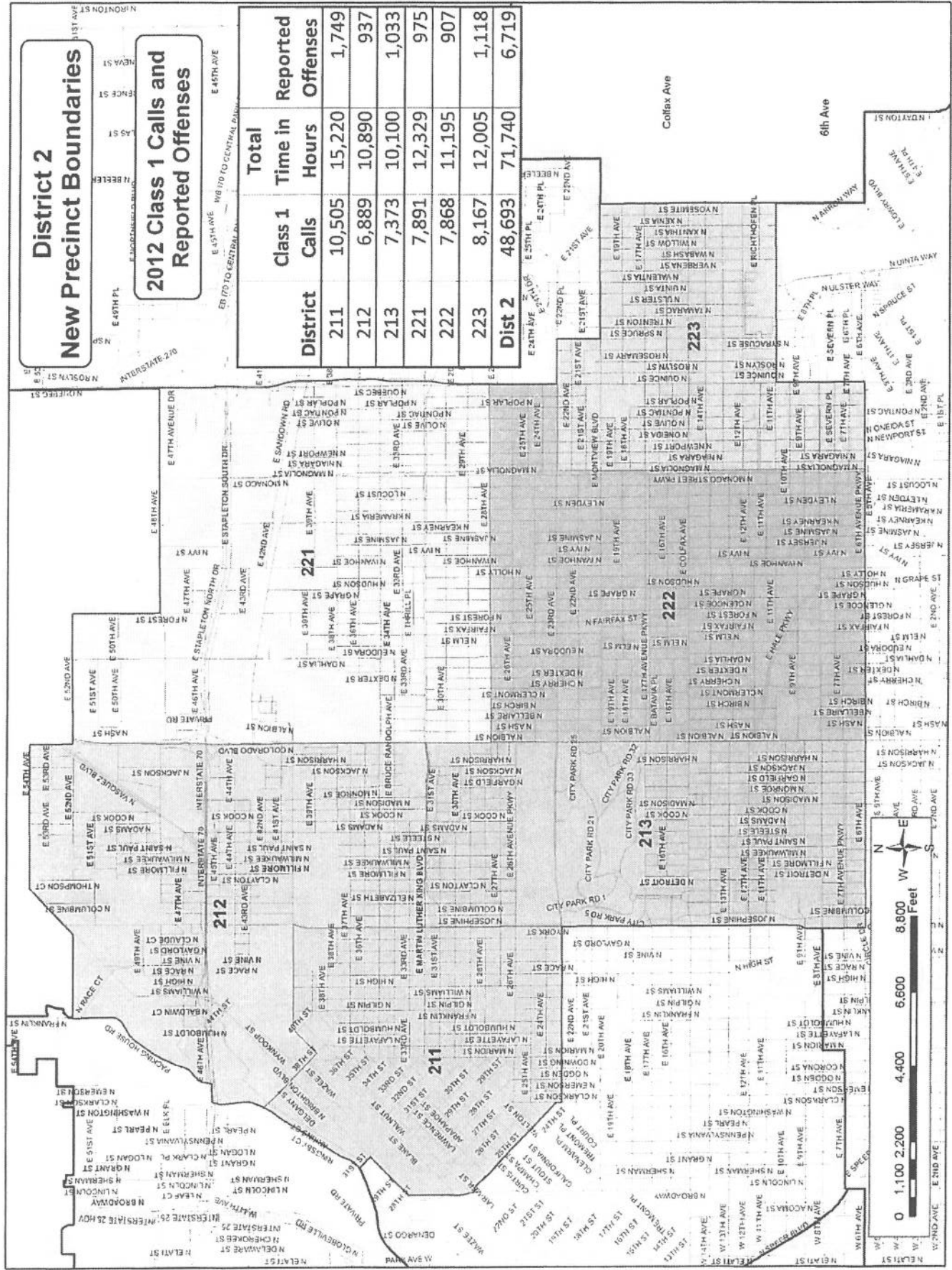
We have been working to provide teams of officers who have greater precinct accountability. It is not efficient to dispatch you across large geographical areas for non-emergent calls. And it doesn't serve the public either. This plan allows one or more officers to patrol a precinct (now much larger than the old ones) and to focus on the hot spots within that area – while still having availability to respond to calls for service within your area of responsibility.

I am excited about this change and the better service it will enable us to provide the citizens we serve. I hope that as you adjust to the new boundaries you also find it a more efficient system for doing your job.

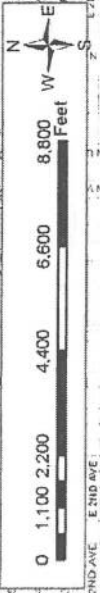
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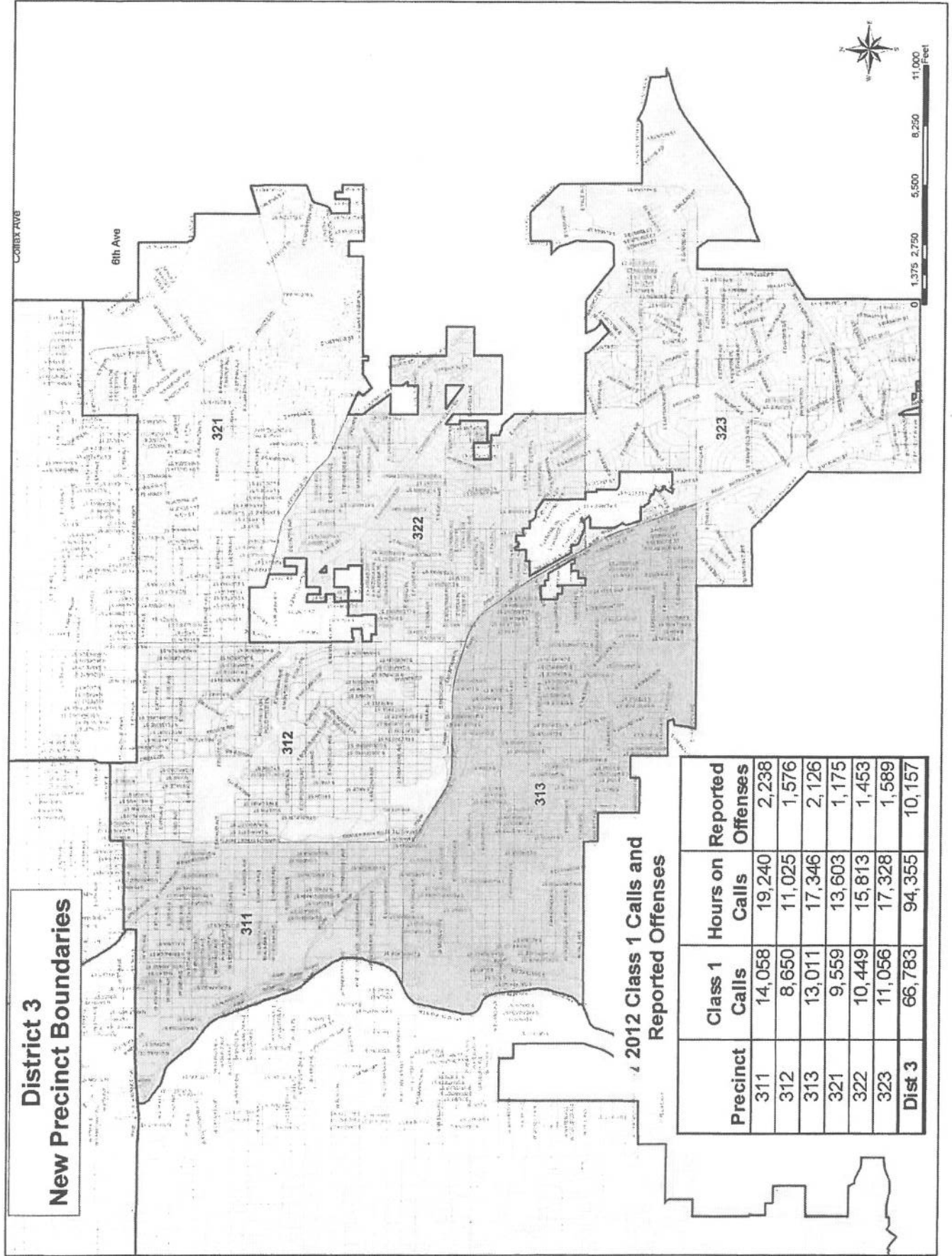


District 2

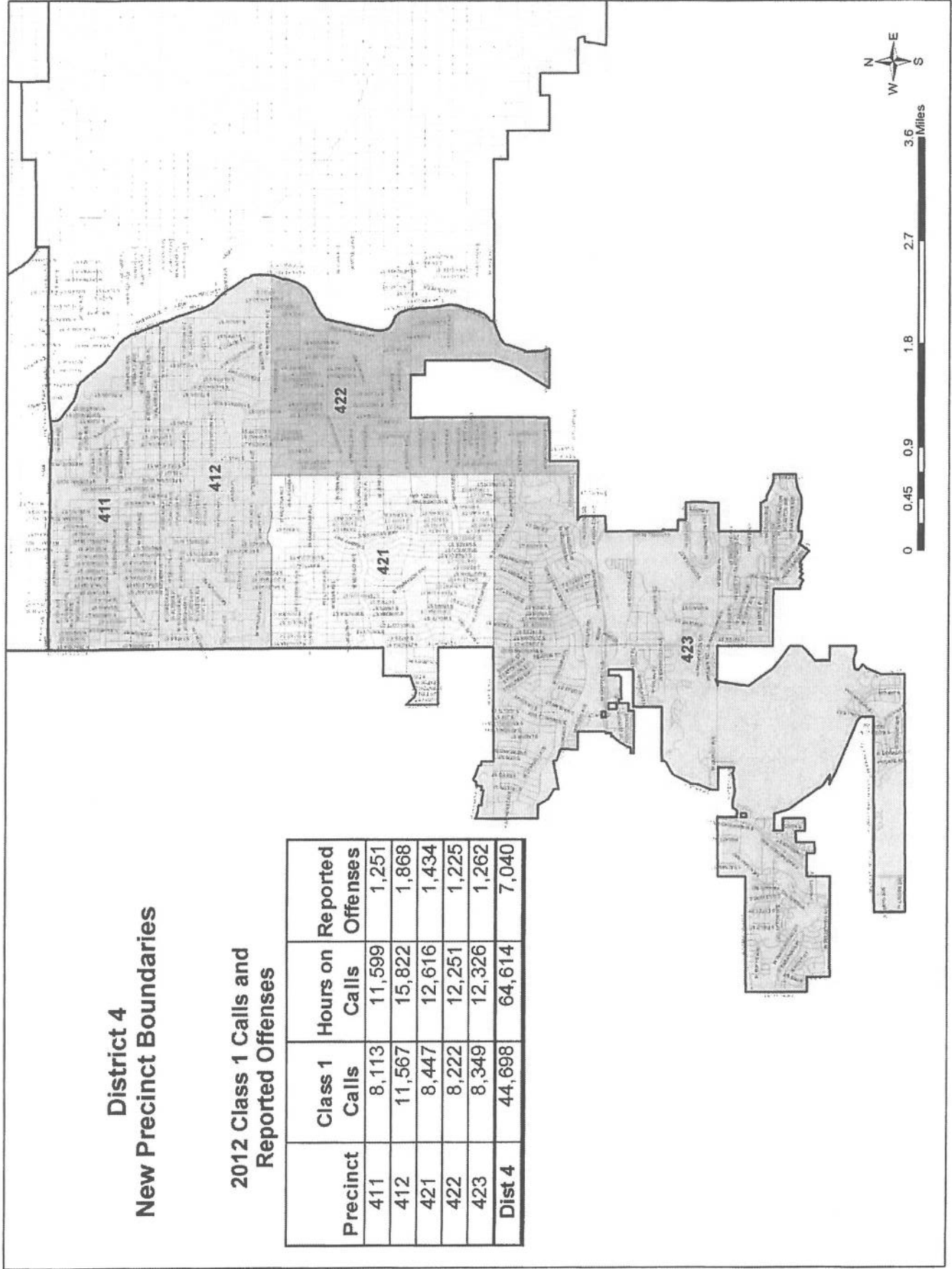




District 4
New Precinct Boundaries

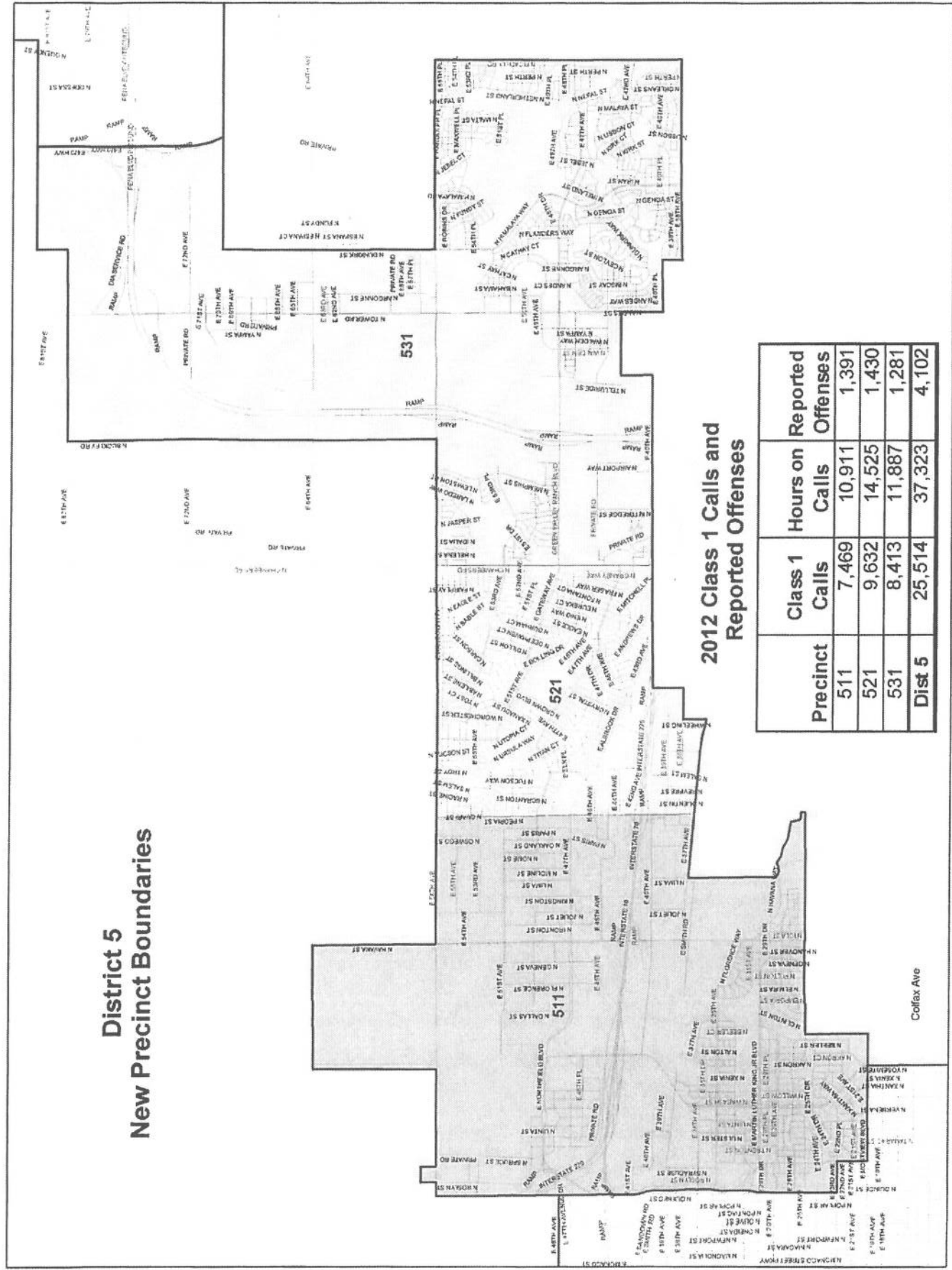

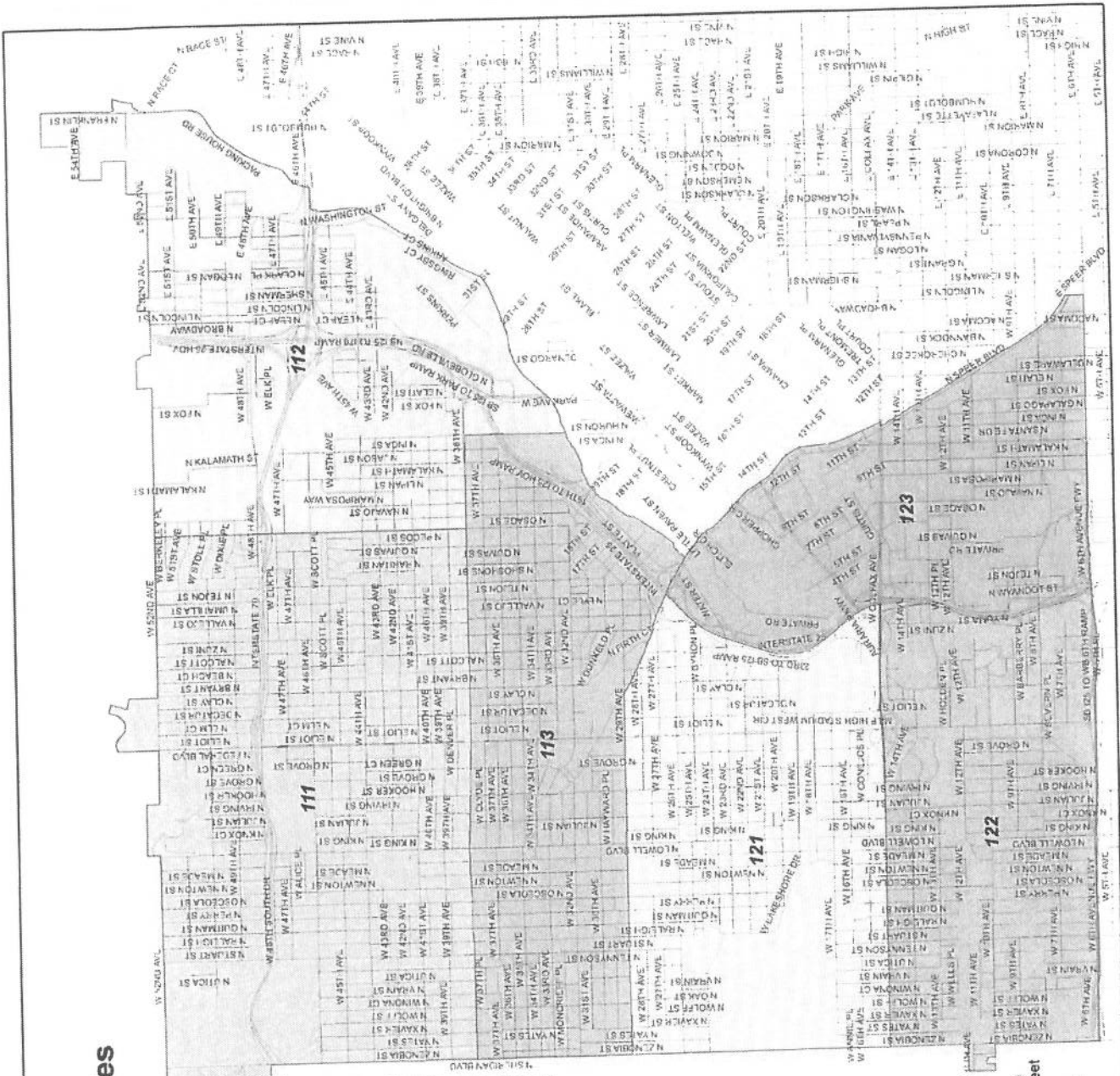
