

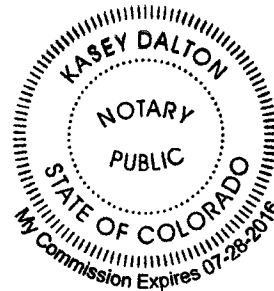

I, Detective Thomas Sobieski # 13669, the affiant herein, being of lawful age and having been first duly sworn upon oath, depose and state that I am a commissioned police officer with the Aurora Police Department, and I have probable cause to believe that there is located at the place known as:

**A white, 2000, Hyundai, Tiburon, 2 door, VIN #KMHJG25F8YU200570 bearing Colorado License Plate 119ROC. Official records of the Colorado Department of Motor Vehicles indicate that this vehicle is registered to: James Eagan Holmes at 1690 Paris Street #10, Aurora, Colorado 80010.**

**This vehicle is currently secured at the Aurora Police Evidence Bay at 13616 East Ellsworth Avenue in the City of Aurora, County of Arapahoe, State of Colorado.**

the following property, which has been used to commit a crime and would be material evidence in a subsequent criminal prosecution. My reasons for this belief follow the description of the property below:

**Any documents, including mail, indicating possession, or indicia of ownership of the vehicle, any item that in the manner it is used or intended to be used, and is capable of producing death or serious bodily injury to include, but not limited to, any firearms, firearm cases or holsters, firearm packaging, firearm ammunition, firearm ammunition packaging, firearm documents, firearm shell casings, or any projectile which is capable of being fired out of a firearm or any paraphernalia associated with firearm usage or any documents that indicate firearm ownership, any clothing, the taking of photographs and video tape, sketches and measurements of the vehicle, hairs, fibers, latent fingerprints, vacuumings, microscopic evidence or evidence patterns or any items that may contain DNA or trace evidence.**

Your affiant is a commissioned police officer with the Aurora Police Department; currently assigned to the Major Crime/Homicide Unit, whose function it is to investigate all homicides that occur within the City of Aurora. Your affiant personally obtained the information contained in this affidavit by talking with witnesses and officers of the Aurora Police Department and reviewing official police reports of Case Number 12-28181.

Your affiant informs the court that on July 20, 2012 at approximately 12:39 A.M., the Aurora Police Communications Center received numerous 911 calls reporting

multiple gunshots being fired inside the Century 16 Theatres at 14300 East Alameda Avenue, Aurora, Arapahoe County, Colorado.

Callers indicated that there were explosions and gunshots inside auditorium #9 and that several people had been shot and injured.

At approximately 12:40 A.M., officers from the Aurora Police Department arrived on scene.

Your affiant advises that Officer Jason Sweeney #300364 arrived on scene and parked his vehicle to the south of the building where he was met by Officer Jason Oviatt #301013. Officer's Sweeney and Oviatt then observed a white Hyundai, Tiburon displaying Colorado License Plate 119ROC parked on the east side of the theatre directly next to the emergency exit for auditorium #9. This vehicle was parked facing the building and a male party was standing outside the vehicle on the driver's side. The driver's side door was open. According to the Colorado Department of Motor Vehicles the Hyundai is registered to James Eagan Holmes at 1690 Paris Street, #10, Aurora, CO 80010.

Officer Sweeney observed this male wearing ballistic protection, including a helmet and gas mask. Officer Sweeney initially believed that this person was a police officer but observed that the gas mask appeared to be an older version of the type that is currently utilized by the police. At this time Officers Sweeney and Oviatt ordered this male to raise his hands, which he did. This male, was taken into custody without incident and was identified by a Colorado Drivers License as James Holmes Dob: 12/13/1987. Officer Sweeney observed a Glock semi-automatic pistol equipped with a green laser sight on the roof of the Hyundai.

Officer Oviatt advised that upon Holmes' arrest he was asked if there was anybody else involved and Holmes' said that there was not. Holmes informed Officer Oviatt that the address on his driver's license was his current address (1690 Paris Street, #10, Aurora, CO) and that there were bombs inside his apartment that would go off if the wires were tripped.

Officers from the Aurora Police Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team responded to 1690 Paris Street and immediately secured the apartment building including James Holmes apartment, #10.

Your affiant advises the following items were removed from Holmes during his arrest: a pair of black military style boots, a black coat, black body armor, a black ballistic helmet, a gas mask, a magazine carrier with nine magazines containing

live rounds, a magazine for a pistol and a green colored plastic doorstop. A black Smith and Wesson, .223 caliber assault rifle was on the ground directly outside the emergency exit door of auditorium #9.

Officers responded and entered auditorium #9 where they located ten gunshot victims. All ten were pronounced deceased.

Your affiant advises that Detective Mark Yacano #15678 entered auditorium #9 and observed a black colored, Remington, 12 gauge, pump action, tactical shotgun on the floor inside the theatre's emergency exit door, nearby were six shotgun shell casings.

Detective Yacano further observed two .40 caliber handgun magazines on the floor beside the Remington shotgun and several .223 caliber rifle shell casings on the floor. All of these items were observed near the front of the theatre.

Detective Yacano observed three additional rifle magazines that contained live rounds, a 90 round "Beta Mag" rifle magazine and another .40 caliber handgun magazine on the floor in the hallway leading towards the lobby of the theatre on the west side of the seating area.

Detective Yacano also observed that a green colored plastic doorstop was attached to the emergency exit door of auditorium #9. This item was similar to the plastic doorstop located among Holmes' property upon his arrest.

Your affiant advises that twenty people suffering from gunshot wounds were transported to University Hospital, one was pronounced deceased. Six people with gunshot wounds were transported to Denver Health Hospital. Twelve people with gunshot wounds were transported to The Medical Center of Aurora. Six people with gunshot wounds were transported to Children's Hospital, one was pronounced deceased. Two people with gunshot wounds were transported to Parker Adventist Hospital and another individual with gunshot wounds was transported to Swedish Medical Center.

Your affiant advises Deputies from the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office Bomb Squad responded to the scene and utilizing an explosive removal robot, removed items from the Hyundai. Included among these items were two rifle cases, a pair of black gloves and a second black Glock semi-automatic pistol contained in a holster.

James Holmes was transported to an interview room located on the third floor of the Aurora Police Department where Detective's Craig Appel #18562 and Chuck Mehl #16848 met with him. Holmes was advised of his rights per Miranda. James Holmes requested an attorney at which time the interview was concluded.

Detective Yacano interviewed Corbin Dates Dob: 07/12/1989. Dates advised that he was inside the theatre when this incident took place. Dates stated that he entered the theatre at approximately 11:30 P.M. and sat in the second row from the bottom near the emergency exit door. Dates stated he observed a male enter the theatre and sit in the first row in the end seat closest to the emergency exit door. Dates stated that he observed this male put his cell phone up to his ear as if he was receiving a phone call and go to the emergency exit door and prop the door open while he talked on the phone.

Dates stated that he (Dates) received a phone call and went to the lobby to meet a friend and when he returned to his seat this unknown male was no longer seated in the first row.

Dates advised that he then observed a party enter the theatre through the emergency exit door wearing a gas mask along with body armor. Dates stated that this party then threw a gas canister towards the seats at which time Dates said he (Dates) got on the ground then he began to hear gunfire.

Detective Tom Wilson informed your affiant that he spoke with Special Agent Jeff Russell from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). Agent Russell provided Detective Wilson with firearm trace reports from the ATF database on the weapons recovered from the theatre crime scene and Hyundai. Detective Wilson informed your affiant that James Holmes purchased a Glock model 22, .40 caliber pistol from the Gander Mountain store located in Aurora, a Remington, model 870, 12 gauge, pump action, tactical shotgun and a Glock model 23, .40 caliber pistol from the Bass Pro Shops located in Denver and a Smith and Wesson, .223 caliber assault rifle from the Gander Mountain store located in Thornton.
