AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF WARRANTLESS ARREST

Being duly sworn upon oath says that there is probable cause for the warrantless arrest of the above-named defendant for the charge(s) stated above, and that the following facts are true and correct to the best of his/her knowledge, information and belief and support the arrest of the defendant.

Your Affiant is a police agent for the Lakewood Police Department for the City of Lakewood, Colorado, whose responsibilities include the investigation of crimes committed in that city. Your affiant has personal knowledge of the facts contained within this affidavit through personal involvement, interviews of witnesses and other police officers, and through reviewing official police reports. This crime occurred in the City of Lakewood, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado.

Victims: Deb Ambriz 8/7/1967
 Gary McKenna 10/7/1951
 Robin Torrez 6/6/1986
 Ronda Torrez 9/25/1963
 Francine Dressler 3/31/1957

On 11/18/2015 at about 1107 hours, a blue colored Jeep Cherokee pulled into the First Bank located at 1940 South Kipling Parkway in Lakewood, Colorado. The Jeep backs into spot right in front of the bank. Three male suspects then got out of the Jeep and went into the bank. The three males were armed with handguns and they demanded money from the tellers while also getting money from the vault. All three male suspects wore dark clothing, wore skeleton masks, and were completely covered.

Bank employee Deb Ambriz, 8/7/1967, was working at the bank at the time of the robbery. Upon seeing the armed males enter the bank, Deb hid under her desk. One of the suspects walked up to her and pointed a pistol at her head while dragging her out from under her desk and demanding the manager. The suspect then threw Deb on the ground, causing a sprained left ankle and an abrasion to her left knee.

The same suspect then grabbed an additional banker hiding under her desk. The suspect pulled Banker Ludmila Zabrodina, 1/22/1952, from under her desk. The suspect then took Ludmilla, Deb, and manager Maria Goyden to the vault where he was able to get money from the vault. The robbers put the money they stole into bags they brought with them. The robbers escaped with \$50,822.

The robbers then ran back out to their Jeep and fled the area. Witness Nancy Pallozzi, 8/7/1967, was in the bank as a customer when the robbers came in. She was able to leave the bank and call the police from the nearby Walgreens. Nancy saw the robbers get into the Jeep and leave through the Walgreens parking lot. Nancy was able see a portion of the license plate and recorded it as "WTO".

GPS Trackers were also taken from the bank and showed the suspects drive south on Estes. The GPS stopped near Garrison and Yale. Lakewood Dispatch then received a call in the area of 3232 South Vance of 3-4 black males running. A few minutes later Lakewood Dispatch aired a shooting at 6882 W Eldorado Place.

Lakewood Agents responded to Eldorado Place and located shooting victim Gary McKenna, 10/7/1951. Gary said he just returned home from the dog park and took his dog into the house. He then heard voices in his garage and he went to his garage to see what was going on. He then saw 3 black males, all with black colored pistols pointed at him. Gary described all three guns as Glocks. The males demanded his car keys for his Minivan that was parked in the garage. Gary noticed the exterior door to his garage had been kicked in. Gary then gave the males his keys and took off running. As he ran, he heard three gun shots. Gary was shot three times. The first shot hit him in the back and exited his abdomen. The other two shots hit his wrist and chest. At this time, Gary is alive in critical condition at Sweedish Hospital.

Agent Leider and Detective Moore were in the area of the shooting when they saw a black male driving away in a silver minivan. They attempted to stop the van with lights and sirens and the van fled south on Pierce near Hampden. The Agents then lost sight of the vehicle near Oxford and Federal. This minivan was later found wrecked and abandoned near the Skate Park at 3207 Oxford Street in Sheridan Colorado. This van was positively identified as the van belonging Gary McKenna.

At about the same time the van was located, Sheridan PD received a call of a shooting at the Sheridan Recreation center at 3207 West Oxford Avenue. Arriving Officers located two victims. Robin Torrez, 6/6/1986, was found in the parking lot with a gunshot wound to her left arm and right hand. Robin's mother Ronda Torrez, 9/25/1963, was also located with an injury to her nose.

Robin and Ronda were transported to Denver General Hospital and interviewed. Robin stated she and her mother Ronda were at the recreation center together, and then left together to Robin's car in the parking lot. Robin got into the driver's seat and started the car to back out for her mother to get in. As she backed up, an unknown black male came up to her and pulled her from the driver's seat. The suspect punched her in the face and she punched the suspect back. A second suspect then arrived. This suspect was also a black male and he hit Robin in the face, knocking her to the ground. Robin heard a gunshot and lost consciousness.

Ronda provided a similar account of what happened. She said as Robin backed up the car, three black male suspects came up and took Robin out of the driver's seat and started beating her. Ronda hit one of the males with her purse and one of the suspects punched Ronda in the face. Ronda said money went everywhere as the suspects fought with them. The suspects attempted to start the car, but they were unable to since it was equipped with a breathalyzer.

At the hospital, Doctors determined that both Ronda and Robin suffered Serious Bodily Injury (SBI). Dr Berrett stated they will likely have to amputate Robin's right pinky finger and signed and SBI form. Dr Broderick stated Ronda had a nasal fracture and also signed and SBI form.

A search of the area where the GPS trackers went was conducted and a stolen Jeep Cherokee 063WTQ was found still running. This was found near 10555 W Jewell Avenue, across the street from the bank. This was identified as the Jeep

used in the robbery. The gps tracker also showed a path leading from 10555 W Jewell Avenue, south to where the last tracker was ditched on the side of the road near South Estes Street and Yale Avenue. A call the dispatch came in several minutes after the tracker was ditched that lead Police to 3232 South Vance Street where the female reporting party saw 3-4 black males with bags, changing clothing while running from a vehicle stuck in the field. This vehicle was later located and towed as evidence. This Tahoe was a rental car. The males ran in the direction of the Eldorado address where Gary McKenna was shot and his vehicle stolen.

Officers responded to the area of the last shooting at 3207 West Oxford to search for suspects. In the same lot as the recreation center where the suspects were last seen, there is an area where school buses are housed. Sheridan dispatch received a call that there was an armed suspect in or near the bus barn. Sheridan Officer Jason Robinson, #0809, checked the area and located a black male hiding under one of the buses. Robinson ordered the male out from under the bus several times and the male eventually complied and was placed in handcuffs. This male was identified as Miguel Sanders, 10/31/1987. Miguel Sanders was found to be currently on US Probation for Armed Bank Robbery.

Detectives later found video from Sheridan High School. Detective Denke found a camera view that shows three black males running from the area of the shooting to the south side of the school. 2 suspect continue running southeast from the school, but the third stays near the front of the school near some bushes. This male is visibly a bald black male wearing a black sweatshirt and pants and carrying a gray jacket. Detective Denke later searched the area of where the male was near the bushes and found a black colored jacket and money with possible blood on it. Miguel Sanders is a black male with a shaved head.

The video then shows this same third suspect go in the direction of the bus barn. Investigators later contacted the reporting party who called into Sheridan Police to report an armed male who tried to get her to drive him. This victim was identified as Francine Dressler, 3/31/1957. Francine stated that she pulled into the bus barn at the end of her shift and parked her bus. She saw a black male hunched over walk at her from the direction of the school. The black male had his hands in his coat and walked directly at her. The male opened his jacket and she saw he had 2 guns, one in each hand. He told her to get back into her bus and drive and she said no. She ran away and saw the male run to the area where she parked her bus.

A search of the area where Miguel Sanders was located was done. This was also the same area Francine last saw the male run to. Near the bus where Miguel was found, several items of evidence were located. There was a gray colored jacket, a black bag with a large amount of US Currency, gloves, a knife, and trash bags. There was also a brown zipper bag with US Currency as well as a black colored Glock pistol with an extended magazine. There was a second gun found as well.

Based on the above, your affiant believes there is probable cause to arrest Miguel Sanders for the following crimes:

- Aggravated robbery for the First Bank located at 1940 South Kipling Parkway.
- 2nd Degree Burglary, Aggravated robbery, Attempted Murder, Motor Vehicle theft for 6882 W Eldorado Place with Gary McKenna as a victim
- Attempted Aggravated Robbery, 1st Degree Assault, and attempted auto theft for 3207 West Oxford Avenue with Robin Torrez as a victim.
- 2nd Degree assault at 3207 West Oxford Avenue with Ronda Torrez as a victim.
- Attempted 2nd Kidnapping and Felony Menacing at 3207 West Oxford Avenue with Francine Dressler as a victim.
