The **Keating Colorado Poll** provides informative, accurate results using live-interviewer telephone surveys and Keating was Colorado's most accurate in the 2016 Presidential predicting Hillary would win by 5 points in Colorado. The following are the Federal numbers in *part one* of the new **Keating Colorado Poll** conducted November 9-13, 2017.

• 64% of Colorado voters are unfavorable toward Donald Trump

Nearly 2/3rds of Colorado voters are unfavorable toward Donald Trump (64% unfavorable to 35% favorable), including a majority 56% who are *very* unfavorable toward him. It's no surprise that Democrats are overwhelmingly unfavorable (91% unfavorable to 8% favorable), while Republicans continue to favor him (73% favorable – 26% unfavorable). However, in this poll we see signs that Colorado's Unaffiliated are acquiring a distaste for Donald Trump - 75% unfavorable to 22% favorable.

• 60% of Colorado voters think President Trump is dishonest and tells lies

Currently, 60% of Colorado voters think President Trump is "dishonest and tells lies", while nearly half that many - 35% - think he is "honest and tells the truth." Women are largely distrustful of President Trump - 64% of women say Trump is "dishonest and tells lies."

• 58% of Colorado voters grade Donald Trump's job performance a D or F

When asked how they would rate the job Donald Trump is doing as President of the United States, 58% of Colorado voters grade his performance as an **D** or **F** - while 30% give Trump an **A** or **B**. Trump's job rating is significantly worse now than what we saw in our March poll when 47% gave him an **D** or **F** and 36% an **A** or **B**.

Interest in the 2018 election is significantly higher among Democrats than Republicans

When asked to rate their interest in the 2018 election on a 1-10 scale the average Colorado voter rates their interest as a 7.8, which is high level of interest for any election and that high level of interest is driven by disproportionately high interest from Democrats (8.4 average and 54% rating their interest a 10), compared to Republicans (7.7 average and 39% rating their interest a 10). This higher level of interest from Democrats is further proof that the increase in turnout among Democrats in the 2017 election is a harbinger of things to come in the 2018 election.

Michael Bennet's favorability is on an upward trend

Colorado's Democratic U.S. Senator Michael Bennet has increased his standing among Colorado voters with a majority 57% favorable to 25% unfavorable, which is significantly higher than what we saw in March (51% favorable – 29% unfavorable).

Keating Research is recognized by Democrats and Republicans alike as providing extremely accurate polling in Colorado. This polling data is based on 500 live-interviewer telephone surveys conducted November 9-13, 2017 among "active" voters statewide in Colorado. For this sample of 500 interviews the worst case margin of error at the 95% level is plus or minus 4.4%. Respondents were chosen at random from a list of voters with phone numbers: 50% conducted on cell-phone and 50% conducted on a land line.
