Re: Placement consideration of Krystal Kenney for community corrections

Members of the Community Corrections Board:

Thank you for taking the time to consider this letter in making your decision on accepting Krystal Kenney into a community corrections program. We are strongly opposed to Ms. Kinney returning to a community-based setting.

Ms. Kenney was sentenced to three years in the Department of Corrections on January 28, 2020. As of the writing of this letter, Ms. Kenney has not yet served even two months in the Department of Corrections. That is abhorrent for the crime and her participation in it.

Ms. Kenney was called by Patrick Frazee on Thanksgiving, November 22, 2018, and told to come to Colorado because "she had a mess to clean up." Rather than contacting authorities, Ms. Kenney rearranged her schedule, lied to family and co-workers, packed up cleaning supplies and drove the 12 hours from Twin Falls, Idaho to Woodland Park, Colorado.


When Ms. Kenney arrived at the condo belonging to Kelsey Berreth, she again made a series of calculated and appalling choices. She described a horrific bloody crime scene that she took nearly four hours to clean up, while wearing a protective suit over her clothes that she brought with her from Idaho. She assisted Patrick Frazee in retrieving the remains of Kelsey Berreth and then participated in the burning of Kelsey's remains. As if this wasn't enough, Ms. Kenney took Kelsey's phone, purse and gun back with her to Idaho, all in an attempt to mislead law enforcement on what had happened to Kelsey.

It almost worked. Kelsey's family had no idea what had happened to her. Patrick Frazee, with Ms. Lee's assistance, misled law enforcement so as to make it appear Kelsey had simply ran away and killed herself. For almost a full month after Kelsey's murder, Ms. Kenney said nothing to law enforcement about what had happened to Kelsey. Ms. Kenney knew the family of Kelsey were desperately looking for her. Ms. Kenney said nothing. It wasn't until she was contacted by and lied to the FBI that her sense of self-preservation took over and she finally told law enforcement what happened.


Ms. Kenney deserves to spend every day of her three-year sentence in the Department of Corrections, but we are cognizant of the fact she will not serve that entire sentence, day for day, in the Denver Woman's Correctional

Facility. She should, however, serve more than two months. She should serve her full sentence in DOC until she paroled from DOC. Serving two months out of a three-year sentence for what she did is simply unconscionable.
