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**ORDER OF SUSPENSION PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-4-104(4), C.R.S.**

Inquiry Panel B (“Panel”) of the Colorado Medical Board (the “Colorado Board”), having reviewed this matter during its meeting of the Panel on February 16, 2018, hereby finds as follows:

1. Respondent was licensed to practice medicine in the state of Colorado on June 13, 1996, and was issued license number DR-35376, which Respondent has held continuously since that date.

2. On February 16, 2018, the Panel reviewed materials relating to case numbers 2017-4344-B; 2018-806-B; and 2018-807-B and found that based upon the information reviewed, the Panel had reasonable grounds to believe that the public health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action and/or that Respondent was guilty of a deliberate and willful violation of the Medical Practice Act. The Panel reviewed information regarding prescriptions for controlled substances written by Respondent, identifying over 900 prescriptions written between approximately July 10, 2017 and November 16, 2017. The Panel reviewed information that Respondent or others were scheduling appointments for Respondent in November 2017 and early 2018. The Panel reviewed information that suggested that Respondent continued to practice medicine after the Panel notified him that his license had expired. Based on the information reviewed, the Panel found that Respondent has practiced medicine and has written prescriptions for controlled substances since his license expired on April 30, 2017.

3. Based upon paragraphs 1-2, the Panel has objective and reasonable grounds to believe and finds that Respondent deliberately and willfully violated the Medical Practice Act and/or that the public health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action.

4. The Panel incorporates paragraphs 1 through 3 in its findings for this Order of Suspension from the Practice of Medicine.

5. The Panel is therefore authorized by Section 24-4-104(4), C.R.S. to suspend Respondent's license to practice medicine in this state pending proceedings for suspension or revocation.

WHEREFORE, it is ordered that:

1. Respondent's license to practice medicine in this state is hereby suspended, effective at 4:00 p.m., Thursday, February 22, 2018.
2. The suspension shall remain in effect until resolution of this matter.
