On July 13, 2012, I was dispatched to 265 Lakeside Ave The Holiday Inn for a medical. Report was a male feeling dizzy and was staying in room 138. Once on scene with Fire and Ems we were able to make contact with the male party staying in the room. The male party was identified as David Kwiatkowski from NH. While trying to speak with David I noticed he was very unsteady on his feet and had a strong odor of alcohol coming from his breath. David's speech was very slurred and I had trouble understanding what he was saying. While in the room with David numerous medication was found in the room and pills were on the floor and on a glass table. There was also a note written by David saying "please call and let her know I passed away. "Tell her I couldn't handle this stress anymore."

It was appearant from the note, pills, and alcohol that David was trying to harm himself. David was advised he needed to go to the hospital and seek help. David stated he did not want to go a few times but I was able to convince him to go. At no time was David acting in an agressive manner. David needed to be helped to the stretcher due to his intoxication. He also mentioned he had a David was then transported to Marlboro Hospital with his wallet, cell phone, note, and medication. Medication bottles taken were manner. David has since been transferred to Umass Worcester.

Management at the Holiday Inn stated they would keep the room secure for the next few days. Management was also advised if anyone should come to the room to collect David's belongings to contact the Marlboro Police first before letting anyone into the room.
