On 12/11/12 at approximately 0153 hours I responded to the area of Griffin Rd, Framingham for a report of two teenage males throwing eggs at someone's house. I learned from dispatch that the the two males were seen walking away from [REDACTED] toward Elm Street. I also learned that they may have exited a small red car prior to throwing the eggs. Officer's Skinnion, Bufford and Vargas responded with me.

As I turned onto Elmfield Rd from Griffin Road I observed a dark colored car at the end of Elmfield Rd by Potter Road. I saw the car turn around and head towards Elm Street. I got closer to the car, saw that it was red and that it was occupied by two people. I stopped the car on Elm St by the Cameron School. Officer Vargas assisted me.

As I approached the driver I saw an empty plastic egg carton on the floor in the rear of the car. I asked the operator if he been egging a house. He said that he had. He handed me his MA driver's license and Newton Police Department ID card in the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that they had egged a coworkers house as a joke and that the coworker knew that it was them. He seemed suprised that the police had been called. He stated that it was just a prank between friends. The red car is registered to [REDACTED].

I released [REDACTED] and his passenger and followed up with the reporting party, [REDACTED]. I learned that [REDACTED] is a sergeant at the Newton Police Dept and that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are his subordinates. After learning that Newton PD personnel were involved in the incident [REDACTED] stated that he would handle the situation. I agreed to let him handle the situation administratively.

A short time later I was patrolling the [REDACTED] neighborhood when I observed a male party in darking clothing walking along the side of the road. He flagged me down. He identified himself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that he was a Newton Police Officer. I asked if he had been with [REDACTED]. He said that he had but he had gotten out of the car to walk. He asked me if [REDACTED] had done something. He denied any knowledge of

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wrong doing. [REDACTED] appeared intoxicated.

I had Officer [REDACTED] transport [REDACTED] to his residence in Natick. I advised [REDACTED] that I found [REDACTED] in the neighborhood.

I did not observe and visible damage at the [REDACTED] residence.

It should be noted that I neglected to identify [REDACTED] passenger in the red car. While I was speaking to [REDACTED] his smart phone was ringing. I could see on the display that the call was coming from [REDACTED]
